

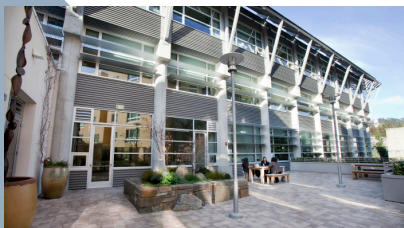
APPLICATION & REGISTRATION

TUITION & HOTEL FEES
