## ugSERU Survey

Osaka University puts considerable efforts in increasing response rate. They are half-way through the winter wave. The current response rate is 17%.

## gradSERU Survey

In Spring four universities are launching the gradSERU survey: two German universities - Universität Bremen and Georg-August-Universität Göttingen, one Swedish – Lund University.

## **SERU Research**

SERU data can be used for an internal purpose - institutional self-improvement as well as scholarly relevant research. In 2017 two papers which raise crucial topics related to students' learning outcomes and quality of students' surveys were published.

In their study, <u>Victoria Porterfield Marc D. Weiner Paul C. Siracusa</u> evaluate sensitive item nonresponse bias in student surveys. In their paper, <u>Irina Shcheglova, Gregg Thomson</u>, and <u>Martha C. Merrill</u> argue that internationalization of higher education is not about quantity of international students coming to host university or going abroad, it is about quality of learning experience and skills students can develop during their studies, one of them is global competence.

#### The UC Berkeley Collegium

SERU campuses have developed many innovative initiatives to support undergraduate and graduate education. We plan to feature one or more in future Newsletters.

In 2012, UC Berkeley launched the Berkeley's Collegium Program with the objective of helping foster the link between teaching and research on its campus. The Collegium's long-term aim is to engender and sustain a cultural shift on campus, whereby faculty and students alike come to view undergraduate engagement in research as a fundamental, desirable, and assumed element of a Berkeley education. Each spring the Collegium invites proposals from faculty for new or existing projects that further the goal of narrowing the gap between teaching and research at Berkeley. For an existing project, grant funds should not be viewed as replacement funding, but rather should be targeted for expanding or improving (e.g., adding a new component) the project. The focus is on undergraduates, but proposals may incorporate graduate and postdoctoral students if relevant. Each academic year, the Berkeley campus fund up to 5 projects of up to \$20,000 each over a one- to two-year grant period (depending on the nature of the project).
